Sněžka is a mountain on the border between the Czech Republic and Poland, the highest point of the Silesian Ridge in the Giant Mountains. Its peak of 1 603 m (5260 ft) is the highest point in the Czech Republic, the Lower Silesian Voivodship, the Giant Mountains and the whole Sudetes.



The most important district of the city:



Cieplice, as this district is called, is a very picturesque, full of life part of our city. It is known for its spa and the extraction of thermal waters used in Spa. It is an ideal place for walks (a beautiful park, a flooded reservoir) so you can fall in love with this place during your stroll.
